ETSB (911): McLaughlin reported that their grant for \$90,000 is pending, they have purchased 3 new radios and antennas, and Woodford County is updating their system and will be able to be a back-up for Marshall County.

Health Dept: Lindstrom reported that there have been personnel changes and there are several openings with one opening being that of a Public Health Nurse. Hector Gomez was present and gave the update on the personnel changes that occurred and those that will occur. The system is being worked on with new FDA codes, Marshall County is the pilot program for this system.

Human Services Transportation Comm.: There was a meeting last month.

Marshall-Putnam Extension: Lindstrom stated that the IVCC Ag program is doing well and they are hiring their 2nd instructor.

Public Comments:

Sharon DeWeerth a previous County Board Member and resident of Saratoga Township wanted to express her concerns about a proposed hog confinement facility that could be pushed onto their neighborhood community in Saratoga Township. DeWeerth who is a retired registered nurse expressed her concerns on air and water pollution. There are serious environment and health concerns. She also expressed concerns of all the antibiotics that are used in the hogs. DeWeerth also expressed a large issue with the roads that will be heavily traveled with heavy equipment. Some of the roads are rated below the 80,000 weight limit. These hog confinements are hog factories not small hog farms. She also stated to please educate yourself to the many aspects of these confinement facilities.

Vicki Waldschmidt a previous County Board Member and resident of Saratoga Township wanted to express her concerns regarding the contamination and health safety of the local aquifer. She also expressed her concerns of the roadways. This facility is putting 20-28 acres of beautiful black dirt out of production.

Karen Hudson is a Peoria Farmer and represents the Illinois Citizens for Clean Air and Water. Hudson presented pictures of damaged roads to the County Board illustrating to the board what had happened in previous communities. She also handed out a packet of sample resolutions that previous County Boards and Villages had passed at their meetings opposing construction of hog facilities. Ms. Hudson also stated that there are numerous loopholes in Illinois that is allowing these facilities.
