## MARSHALL COUNTY BOARD MEETING October 8, 2020

The Marshall County Board met through a Zoom Session for the October Board meeting on October 8, 2020 at 8:30 a.m. Chairman Kroeschen called the meeting to order. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call shows: Chairman Kroeschen, Vice-Chairman McGlasson, McLaughlin, Minnick, Donna, Johnson, Balensiefen, Stash, Gauwitz, Daykin, Lindstrom and Bakewell present.

It was moved by Stash and seconded by Balensiefen to approve the September minutes as presented. Roll call vote shows: 12 yes, 0 no, and 0 absent.

County Engineer Pat Sloan reported on Zoning. Sloan stated that one permit was issued to the Community Solar Schulte Farm North of Lacon. Construction has been started. Sloan stated that he has been in contact with the other two other Community Solar Developers that have received special use permits before which are currently up. There will not be a meeting in October or November as there currently are no special permit applications. The transportation analysis was accepted. \$330,000 has been received as of Monday, October 5<sup>th</sup>. The Letter of Credit should be here soon, and construction can not start until it is received. The Letter of Credit will be in the amount of 3 million dollars. Paving will start next week.

Sloan reported on Highway. Wenona Road is currently open, and it will be paved before winter. There is a County Aid Project request from Bennington Township, and they have the funds available. Total project will be a half million dollars and the County will have to fund \$105,000 for this project, \$95,000 Township Bridge Program, the rest Bennington Township will cover.

Recycling has been normal. The Electronic Collection Day will be canceled due to COVID-19. He stated he has an employee out for testing at this time. Currently it is too much risk having people bring things in.

Mitch Forrest and Lori Sea from Central IL Agency on Aging Resources were present. Mitch stated that he has been with the program for 10 Years and is certified. They serve care givers that help with adults that have disabilities. They have a program that is called Rested Program that provides a care giver a councilor that can help the care giver manager their stress. They currently partner with MSW Projects in Henry with meals on wheels and transportation. This program currently is served in Marshall, Tazewell, Peoria, Fulton, Stark & Woodford Counties. They are working on creating a new program called Coffee Clutch. Information was given to each County Board Member and will be posted on the County website.

Chairman Kroeschen noted that he received a letter from a concerned citizen about people not wearing a mask in businesses. It was encouraged that people need to wear a mask when entering places. It was noted that the Marshall County Officials did not attend the Lincoln Day dinner that was held due to the circumstances.

**Finance/Budget:** Bakewell reported that the general fund is \$265,000 ahead last year at this time we were about \$219,000 which is about \$46,000 ahead. He stated that the revenues are down about \$198,000 due to lower sales, income tax, fines, fees, permits etc. Expenses are down about \$246,000 from 2019.
